

## **Other Police Activity**

Other police activities recorded are:

- Suspicious Situations
- Citizen Assists
- Alarms
- Assisting Other Agencies
- Missing persons
- And all other calls for service

Our police department handles a variety of calls. In this section, I will highlight some common calls for police services in our township. Below is a breakdown of calls common to CTPD:

#### Suspicious Situation Calls

Suspicious situations are called into the police department where the officer is unable to find the "causation" of the problem. Additionally, citizens will often call the police for suspicious activities they observe throughout the township. In 2022, our staff investigated 282 suspicious situations, compared to 207 suspicious situations in 2021. More suspicious situation calls were received in the months of April and July. We remind our readers to please report any suspicious activity, regardless of how small the activity may be.

#### Citizen Assist Calls

Citizen assists can range from assisting citizens whose vehicle breakdown on the roadway, helping change a tire, checking citizens homes while they are on vacation, lockouts, or officers performing peace keeping functions, etc. Our staff assisted people 989 times in 2022, compared to 1403 calls for citizen assists in 2021. Assists were higher in the month of June. This is a reduction of 414 assists, because the 414 assists were to the Chikaming Township Park Board, which were recorded in 2022 using a different data collection system.



#### Alarm Calls

A great deal of homes and businesses have alarms installed. In 2022, our staff investigated **190** alarms, compared to **199** alarms in 2021. None of the alarms resulted in a burglary investigation.

#### Assist Other Police Agencies

Assisting other agencies may range from assisting another police unit in another jurisdiction or working collaboratively with our neighboring jurisdictions. Our staff assisted other law enforcement agencies 159 times in 2022.

#### All Other Complaints

All other types of complaints, such as trespass, lost and found property, stalking, family issues, juvenile matters, retail fraud, missing persons, peace keeping, liquor violations, health and safety, miscellaneous criminal offenses, vehicle and VIN inspections, account for our staff's daily activities as well. Our staff handled 82 calls for services regarding the foregoing types of calls in 2022.

### **Traffic Stops**

In 2022, in a team effort to keep our township's streets and roadways safe and support our traffic safety initiative, our staff stopped 436 motorists on township roadways and expressway for various traffic law violations, compared to 409 traffic stops in 2021.

#### **Traffic Violations/Citations**

Our officers worked diligently to make our roadways safe for travel within the township. Traffic violations include, but are not limited to:

- Speeding
- Improper Lane Changing
- Failure to Yield
- Disregarding a Traffic Control Device or Sign
- No Proof of Insurance
- Improper Registration



- Moving Violations causing Traffic Crashes
- Seat Belt Violations
- Ordinance Violations
- Parking Tickets

In 2022, our officers issued 376 traffic and ordinance citations.

## Verbal Warnings

Verbal warnings are given by officers to law violators in lieu of issuing citations. A great deal of verbal warnings are given on traffic stops for a motorist who was observed violating the Michigan Motor Vehicle Code; however, some verbal warnings are given to people who violate local ordinances upon any of the parks and beaches of the Township, or for other violations of state law.

In 2022, our officers contacted and verbally warned 375 people who violated a state law, traffic code, or a local ordinance.

#### Arrests

An arrest is defined as the most invasive level of encounter by a law enforcement officer and a citizen. An arrest is made when an officer has reasonable cause to believe a crime is occurring or has occurred. A person may be jailed or issued an appearance citation, or post bond in lieu of being jailed for a crime. The following listed crimes are not all inclusive; however, the list will give the reader a baseline of the crimes commonly handled in Chikaming Township:

- Drunk Driving
- Obstructing Justice
- Disorderly Conduct
- Disturbing the Peace
- Driving While License Suspended
- Possession of Narcotics
- Arrests based upon Valid Arrest Warrants
- Fraud
- Domestic Violence
- Assault
- Township Ordinance Violations (Misdemeanor Offenses)
- Larceny/Theft
- Burglary



In 2022, our officers arrested 103 people for various crimes, compared to 92 arrests in 2021. Some of these people were taken to jail, while others were cited at the scene and released to appear in court later.


#### **Traffic Crashes**

Traffic crashes are subdivided into four different types of vehicular cashes. These types of crashes are:

- Personal Injury Crash
- Fatal Car Crash
- Property Damage Crash
- Private Property Damage Crash


In 2022, our officers investigated **183** traffic crashes upon the roadways of the township, compared to **120** traffic crashes in 2021. No fatalities in 2022. The increase may be attributed, in part, by the Blizzard of 2022 and the increased population in our area.

We currently have three (3) patrol cars in our fleet, which are:


- 2022 Dodge Durango

In 2022, our officers drove about 239,293 miles to deter, detect, and apprehend criminal offenders.



#### 2020 State Accreditation

In 2020, your CTPD team became the only state accredited police agency in Berrien County. CTPD was presented with an accreditation plaque from the Michigan Association of Chief of Police on October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020. We remained accredited in 2022 because of the hard work of our men and women at CTPD.



#### **Reserve Police Officers**

The Reserve Police Officer Program was implemented within the police department in 2015. These men and women volunteer their time to the police department with the hopes of giving something back to the community they serve. In 2022, our reserves volunteered an estimated **360-Volunteer Hours** to our community.

I am excited to present the 2022 annual fire department report to the residents of Chikaming Township. The year 2022 saw numerous changes throughout the department; equipment upgrades, vehicle replacement, hiring new team members, and the retirement of others – including the departure of long-time Fire Chief, Mike Davidson. A personal thank you to him for his 36+ years of dedicated service to the department!

The department members are a committed group of full-time, part-time, and paid-per-call individuals who respond to both fire and medical emergencies 24x7x365. They work hard to ensure that Chikaming Township is a safe place for our residents and the many visitors! Department members logged a total of 2,340 hours responding to emergency calls for service and improving their skills during training drills in 2022.

At the end of June, Brad Miller was hired from our paid-per-call roster into a full-time position. His primary responsibilities, other than responding to emergency calls for service, include public education, community outreach, and vehicle and equipment inspections/maintenance which ensure the department is always prepared to respond to the next incident.

A familiar face around Chikaming Township, Greg Nelson, who is responsible for code enforcement and our rental safety program, took on additional responsibilities through the fire department. He will work side by side with Brad on department programs and respond to fire and medical emergency calls.

We would like to thank every great member of the Chikaming community for their continued support of our department by providing us with the equipment and training needed to keep the community safe.









