New Zoning Ordinance update:

A small work group consisting of Township Board member Rich Sullivan, Zoning Administrator Van Thornton John Shipman and Doug Dow, has been appointed to review the existing document and make changes to simplify, remove errors, modify areas of noted controversy, and make the document more useable and understandable by those who would use it. Grace Rappe was asked to specifically review the Landscaping section and provide any comments she has to offer.

The work group will meet weekly over the next six weeks to conduct this review, conference with the Berrien County Planning Commission representative, then work with the Zoning Consultant to incorporate changes, and communicate results to the Planning Commission and the community.

Architect and contributor to the Zoning Ordinance process, Scott Rappe, offered an opinion on the intent of the C-S Zoning District.
